- Nicole Galea for the important work she has commenced in running the second hand uniform shop;
- I congratulate School Council for their key role in the Governance of the school and appreciate their support this year; and
- The admin staff who are the face of our school; always on the ball and making the school tick over in an efficient manner.

2019 Reflections and Future Plans:

As another busy school year comes to an end, and I complete my second year of Principal at Bell, I remain in awe of the passion from our students which drives them to want to make a difference in our world, tackling big issues from climate change to endangered animals and pollution. The global awareness of our students at such a young age is truly remarkable. Not only are our students extending their learning beyond the four walls of a traditional classroom, at a young age they are becoming active and informed citizens determined to live their values and make a difference to local and global issues.

This year I have continued to value the support of the parent/carer community. Whether it be involvement in school events and activities, opportunities to support the learning of our students in classrooms or through the contribution of your expertise to better our school environment, I am truly appreciative of your time and efforts.

A number of community events served as highlights for me throughout the year, including the La Bellissima Festa, where we saw the students dance and perform in class groups to various Italian songs. P-3 and Year 4-6 Athletics Days are always a highlight, watching students demonstrate persistence through taking part in a range of sporting events and, of course, getting to have some fun and build teamwork along the way.

Along with these events, this year has seen the following projects come to fruition and new school initiatives implemented:

- Transformation of the North Oval play space, re-development of the South Oval and of course the \$2M development of the library, upstairs classrooms and toilets.
- The rollout of Compass modules including Attendance and NewsFeed to strengthen our home/school communication.
- The introduction of the Berry Street Education Model and, in particular, the consistent implementation of Ready to Learn scales, brain breaks and morning circles. These initiatives are helping our students begin the school day in a positive way and are promoting and prompting discussions and the building of relationships between teachers and students.
- Phasing in of DET recommended frameworks and policies for the delivery of consistent behaviour management, including our Behaviour Matrix that supports the teaching of expected behaviours through alignment with our school values.
- Regular open mornings/afternoons and 'Celebrations of Learning' to better connect parents/carers to daily learning in the classrooms, and to gain an understanding about the language of learning.

All of which serve to strengthen our community connections and the wellbeing, engagement and learning of our students at Bell.

And while this year draws to a close, we are already looking forward to what next year brings. Again there will be more exciting projects to enhance our learning and play spaces and the implementation or strengthening of new and existing initiatives or approaches, which will make a positive impact across the school. This includes:

- Installation of nets in the Northern Play space over this upcoming break. This will enable us to once again allow ball games in this space as windows will be protected from wayward balls.
- A Landcare grant will see us make some improvements to the butterfly garden play space.
- Purchasing of new furniture for our new classroom and library spaces. At the moment, our old furniture has
 been moved into this space as a temporary measure. This will enable our staff and students to get a feel for
 the space before we can make some decisions around new and innovative furniture that will support the idea
 of flexible learning spaces.
- Transformation of the shelter shed. This project will use our vital fundraising dollars to make our shelter shed an engaging passive play space. This idea came from the community survey and is a great example of 'student voice' where we can take the kid's ideas and make them a reality.
- Continuation of our Berry Street training and implementation of actions from the Stamina, Character and Engagement domains.
- Introduction of a formalised coaching/mentoring program to support staff professional learning and consistency in our approaches to teaching and learning.

And of course we will continue in our efforts to seek financial support for Phase 2 of our Master Plan - which of course is the community gymnasium and music facility.

Finally, I'd like to thank the entire Bell Community for another positive and enjoyable year. I wish every family and staff member a relaxing, enjoyable and safe summer holiday.

Reporting to Parents/ Carers

Thank you to the parents/carers who took the time to provide us with feedback regarding our formal reporting processes through our Reporting to Parents/Carers survey. Along with the feedback from staff and students, we will be utilising this information to inform any adjustments to our formal reporting procedures for the new school year.

As a direct result of the feedback from our parents and teachers, we are making the following adjustments to our year level information evenings that are conducted at the beginning of each year. As of next year, the Information Nights will be conducted in Week 3 of Term 1. This will enable the timely sharing of information that is pertinent to your child's 2020 year level. In addition to bringing these sessions forward by a couple of weeks, we are also communicating the dates of these evenings to parents/carers earlier, and hope that with advanced notice, families can make time in their busy schedules to attend the relevant meetings and strengthen the school/family partnership.

Each grade level team will be holding Information Sessions to outline key aspects of their programs to ensure parents and carers are well informed about routines, student expectations and learning practices that will be consistently implemented across the year level. While it is important that some information regarding our school processes is reiterated on a yearly basis, we are also wanting to communicate with parents with regards to areas of their child's schooling that they are seeking further information. Therefore, again as a result of the feedback from our survey, we are offering for individuals to contribute ideas to help inform the agenda for the information evening, ensuring it is aligned to the needs of our parent and carer community. From the Junior School Council:



The grade 5 and 6 ISCs, as well as the School Captains, attended the National Young Leaders Day earlier in the year, we listened to some inspirational speakers share their opinions on leadership. We also spoke at a School Council meeting and explained to the teachers and parents what being a JSC rep involved. Some reps even put together a video to help inform them of what we do as JSCs. One of the most fun meetings to attend was the Darebin Council 'Walkshop' where the 5 and 6 reps brainstormed ideas for Walktober, it was helpful and a major part of the planning stage.

Some fun things that we organised were a staff versus student soccer game and a sports dress-up day for Movember, which raised \$502. There was a book week parade, JSC ran the assembly and we collected \$335 for Spinal Muscular Atrophy. Some reps organised a Casual Clothes Crazy Hair Disco, which raised \$450 for State School Relief. The most successful event was the World's Greatest Shave, in which nine brave students shaved their heads, collectively raising a whopping \$8,817.94. We had a prep to grade 3 mini athletics day, Where kids enjoyed 21 athletics activities, A few reps had the honour of hosting La Bellissima Festa, the Italian festival and did an excellent job. JSC also help the school in small or large ways by doin odd jobs around the place.


The students selected demonstrated commitment and excellence in Music, Art, Sport or Italian. Congratulations to all our award winners!




From the Fundraising Team:

BELL PRIMARY FETE - NOVEMBER 2020


Are you planning on having a 'Summer Clean Out', are your Fruit Trees full and ready to make preserves or are you making the most of time off over the summer in the garden?

We would like to acknowledge our wonderful Event Captains who very kindly volunteered their time to coordinate and run the various fundraising events this year – without you, these events could not have taken place!


