Find below one of the games demonstrated on the night, Rowco. It's lots of fun, can be enjoyed by adults and children, and you only need a deck of cards to play! If your kids have played it at school, then I'm sure they can teach you!

ROWCO (by Paul Swan)

Grades P-6

Mathematical Focus:

- Addition, Subtraction, Mental Computation

Aim of the game:

- To get a higher score than your opponent based on the value of the cards you collect.

Materials:

Deck of Cards

HOW TO PLAY

- 1. Rowco is a two-player game.
- 2. Cards are laid out 'face-up' in a 5 x 5 grid (this can be expanded to 6 x 6), with one 'moving card' which is face down in the middle.
- 3. Player one goes first and chooses either 'rows' or 'columns'.
- 4. They must move the 'moving card' along the row (or column) it is in and stop on a chosen card, which is then removed.
- 5. Player two then moves the 'moving card' from its new location along the column (or row, the opposite of player one), collecting a card.
- 6. Play one goes again, moving the 'moving card' along a row to a new card.
- 7. The game continues until a player can't make a move.
- 8. Cards are then added up, with the highest score winning. Encourage players to use strategies such as 'number bonds to 10' when adding their totals.

Possible adaptations:

- Use 'negative' cards (this may be two of the four 'suits' in your deck of cards).
- Adding 'bonus' cards, such as a 'King' being worth 20 points, which can make the strategy more complex.






