From the Principal:

Prep Enrolments

Thank-you to those families who have completed Prep enrolments for 2020. It is important that we have notice of enrolments as early as possible in order to develop our workforce plan for 2020.

If you have not enrolled your child for Prep next year and they have an older sibling at school, an enrolment form can be sent home to be completed and returned to the school.

General Grounds Space

We are aware of the impact of the increased traffic and rain that has contributed to some really muddy and slippery areas in the school grounds. Matting has been placed in front of the portable toilets, plans are in place to extend the matting further to create safer pathways.

South Oval Re-Development

With two main areas of work taking place within the school grounds our main concern is the safety and wellbeing of students, parents/ carers and teachers. To this end, **ALL** of the South Oval area will be closed for term three, including the July holidays from July 1 – October 7, unless there is further notice. *This means that there will not be access to the school grounds from Oakover Road.* The alternative is to use the path along Scotia Street and enter from one of the points along there. The Scotia Street entry points include a small pedestrian gate adjacent to the Astroturf with access to the bike racks in that area, the main front gate to the school, the double gates further north nearest to the Year 2 portable classrooms with access to bike racks there, and the furthest double gates up near the laneway. It is important that the workspace of our developers is not compromised and that we will be rewarded with the best outcome on completion of their work. Evergreen, the south oval development group, will do a letter drop to houses in the immediate vicinity of the school to inform them of expected heavy traffic times. Traffic will be kept to a minimum in key times before and after school. Parking is going to be very limited, so we also ask you to consider how you can support each other with limited vehicle parking near the school.

End of Term

Next week the Year 4s are heading to Bike Camp in Maldon. Thank you to Mr A and Rebecca Foulds for the Bike Ed instruction that they have provided during this term. I am sure there will be many enthusiasts looking forward to some challenging rides and camp activities. There will not be an assembly on Monday, our end of term assembly will be held on Friday June 28 at 2pm.

School Council Summary:

Council held its fifth meeting of the year on 30th May.

The major item discussed was future fundraising priorities, continuing our discussion at the previous council meeting. Joining the meeting for this discussion were two of our fundraising working group convenors Bridget Ah-Ching and Nicole McCulloch. We noted the success of recent fundraising activities such as the Mother's Day and Election Day stalls, and the importance of having a set of funding priorities for the school. We agreed on a process for developing funding priorities, which involves collecting ideas from students and staff in the first instance, and then seeking input from parents and carers to create a short list. Look out for a request to provide input on funding priorities in the next few weeks!

We also received a report from the Fete Committee on options for a Fete late in 2019. Council agreed to postpone the Fete until 2020 given as the construction work and south oval resurfacing mean that there will be limited space for such a large event in 2019. We'll be looking at other options for a whole of school event in late 2019.

David updated council on plans for report writing and advised Council that Assistant Principal Marg Sneddon was resigning after many years of service at Bell and in the education sector. We'd like to thank Marg for her important role at the school over such a long time, and particularly for leading the school through a substantial transition in 2017. We wish Marg all the best for the future!

COMPASS UPDATE

A very important letter from Marg Sneddon was handed to your child/ren recently. It contained the link, user name and password for your Compass Parent Portal. If you haven't already, please chase this letter URGENTLY and spend some time setting up Compass on your device of choice.

From Tuesday 11 June, parents will be expected to enter their own child's absence reason directly on Compass. This, in turn, updates the classroom roll automatically. If this does not occur, an SMS will be sent requesting you update Compass with a reason. If you do not update your child's attendance, this Unexplained Absence will be reflected in your child's Semester Reports.

From <u>Tuesday 11 June</u>, please do not ring or email the school or teacher advising of your child's absence. Please enter this information via the Compass Parent Portal.

Student absences need to be entered on your Compass Parent Portal. If you do not enter an absence reason, you will receive an SMS reminding you do so.

LATE ARRIVAL or EARLY DEPARTURE

Please still call past the office to advise if you have arrived late or are leaving early and we will note this on Compass for you. This will automatically update the teacher's roll. Eventually we will be installing a screen in the foyer and you will be required to enter this information yourselves.

CAMPS, SPORTS, EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

* APPLICATIONS CLOSE FRIDAY 28 JUNE *

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid, means-tested concession card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 per primary school student.

HOW TO APPLY:

There will be a pink CSEF application form sent home in the Parent Pack, or just download the form from www.eduction.vic.gov.au/csef.

If you applied for the CSEF in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- <u>new student enrolment</u>: your child has started or changed schools in 2018, or you did not apply in 2017;
- <u>changed family circumstances</u>: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2018.

Disciplining your Sensitive Child - Behaviour

Disciplining sensitive kids is usually never straightforward. Sensitive kids, those creative, empathetic types who generally wear their hearts on their sleeve and take even the slightest criticism personally need to be handled with care. It's tempting to avoid disciplining them altogether to avoid hurting their feelings. But sensitive kids need also to learn to become social and likeable so they can reach their full social potential. They also like to feel safe and secure so a permissive 'do whatever' approach is not for this group. If your child is the sensitive, worrying type make it a rule of thumb to check in with your child after discipline to make sure that everything is okay. You need to make peace even if you can't see the need.

Some discipline techniques to avoid with sensitive children:

Shaming, naming and blaming

'You should be ashamed of yourself'; "You're a naughty girl" and "It's all your fault!" should be left out of every parents' armoury of responses as they often do more harm than good, and can be ineffectual with children who learn to tolerate persona affronts. With sensitive types they can have a devastating impact on their self-esteem. Such phrases uttered with emotional intensity (read anger and frustration) can more than just sting – they can have a lasting impact on kids who wear their hearts on their sleeves.

Withdrawal of love and affection

There's a difference between withdrawing affection and withdrawing attention. The latter is temporary and is aimed at specific behaviours that kids use to keep parents busy. The former is more permanent and can be accompanied by shaming or guilt-laden language and can be damaging to relationships and children's sense of self. Sensitive children often confuse the temporary withdrawal of attention with withdrawal of affection so it's probably best to keep ignoring children's behaviour to a minimum.

Isolation

Sensitive kids usually hate the isolation of time out. They tend to fret rather than reflect, which is the main purpose of this method.

Discipline to favour with sensitive children:

Give them a chance to make good

Most sensitive kids crave adult approval so a stern look or a change in voice tone is often enough to communicate your disapproval followed by some advice about better behaviour next time. Give them the chance to make good or to pick up their game and they will generally respond in kind.

Be friendly and firm

While friendly and firm discipline sounds like a cliché it is very much a reality for sensitive kids. Move close, speak quietly and assure them your relationship is not harmed by their poor behaviour.

Use consequences sparingly

If kids repeatedly break a rule or misbehave when the limits are clear use a consequence but make sure you deliver it like a neutral cop. Watch for a shame reaction and adjust accordingly. Importantly, try to work out why she or he is behaving poorly or breaking a limit or rule.

Replace time out with time in

Place them close to you – on a chair or similar spot – when they need to calm down or spend some time pondering their behaviour. Quiet time doesn't need to be isolating time.

Repair the relationship

It's always good to revisit your child after discipline to re-establish good will. In a practical sense it's not always possible. However if your child is the more sensitive, worrying type make it a rule of thumb to check in with your child after discipline to make sure that everything is okay. You need to make peace even though you can't see the need.




