Future Planning

These chilly, fresh mornings lead into such beautiful Melbourne days! We are so lucky to have these beautiful grounds for the students to run and play in. As our numbers increase so does the pressure on the grounds but we will be maintaining the wide open space on the southern end of the school and an emphasis on natural play spaces and shaded areas. We are expecting a new relocatable to be delivered before the end of August. This will be positioned according to the 2012 DEECD architects plan alongside the other relocatables on the northern oval. This building will go someway to relieving the pressures of limited space at the school at the moment. I submitted the census figured for 2015 with an expected in enrolment of 472. I am often asked when we are go-

ing to cap numbers. This is not my decision. The decision is made by the Regional Director based on space availability. Space is not an issue in this school as we have the DEECD required balance of permanent and relocatable buildings and the space to provide more as the enrolment fluctuates.



from the amazing local selection around the venue.


What if there are only two of us, not enough to make a table? Don't worry, we will find a spot on a table of like-minded people. A great way to meet new people!
