ANZAC CENTENARY, 2014

Bell Primary School opened in 1928 and has a long history in the Preston community. In honour of the ANZAC centenary, the school will conduct a cross curriculum unit on early 20th century history of Preston with a focus on the values and contribution the ANZAC culture has made to the development of Australian society in term 1 of 2014. I have begun to research the history of the school "Avenue of Honour". At some time the avenue was planted in honour of returned service personnel. A local librarian, Jackie Goddard has been unable to find reference to our trees in local papers and photographic collections. A clear picture of the story behind the Avenue will be recorded for posterity. The Avenue will then be registered with the Avenue of Honour Register project now currently underway.

During our School Council meeting last week, school captains Karina and Lachy and vice captains Pearl and Rylee met with us all. They made a presentation about their role in the school and the leadership skills they have developed. They spoke very eloquently and confidently, and the school council members were impressed with the way they carried themselves at an official school meeting.

TREE PLANTING DAY

WITH THE GRADE 1/2'S.



Plants included: Native Grasses—tussock grass, kangaroo grass Shrubs - hop bush, native indigo, sweet bursaria, gold dust wattle Ground covers - native bluebells, everlasting daisies.

On Friday the 26th of July the 1/2s planted trees, shrubs and grasses in our butterfly garden for National Tree Day. After doing a 'Plant it Right' session all the 1/2s were planting experts! A big thank you to Angela Foley and Merri Creek Management for the day of activities. On Tree Day we first had to check for and pull away any long roots, then we squeezed and squashed the tubes to get our plants out. When our plant was free, we put it into a wonderfully dug hole (thank you lovely diggers), mulched it and watered it. All the new plants are Indigenous species and will make our garden beautiful and special. We now have some new native grasses - tussock and kangaroo, along with hop bush, native indigo, sweet bursaria, gold dust wattle shrubs, native bluebells and everlasting daisies. Please come and have a look at all our hard work. We can't wait to see all the plants grow.

Plant it Right, Written by 1/2C

These steps will help you plant seedlings properly. We learned these steps from Angela Foley, from Merri Creek Management Committee.

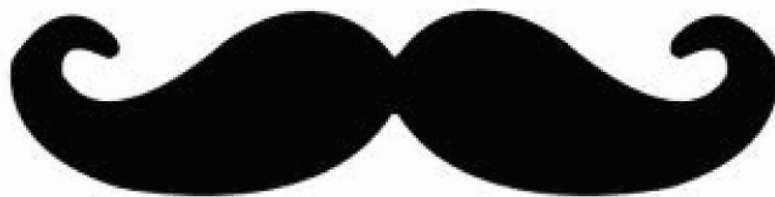
- 1) *Dig a hole big enough for a tube stock to fit in.*
- 2) *Dig away the mulch.*
- 3) *Rip the roots off of the bottom of the seedling.*
- 4) *Squeeze the black tube to loosen the plant.*
- 5) *Put your thumb and pointer finger around the plant and hold the tube with your three other fingers.*
- 6) *Tap the plant firmly against something to loosen it.*
- 7) *Take the plant out carefully, trying not to rip the roots.*
- 8) *Put the plant in the hole.*
- 9) *Pat down the soil around the plant.*
- 10) *Make sure the plant the roots are under the soil and that the stem is above the soil.*
- 11) *Put a bit of mulch back around the plant.*
- 12) *Water your plant. Be careful not to water it too much.*

These steps will help your seedling to grow in your garden.

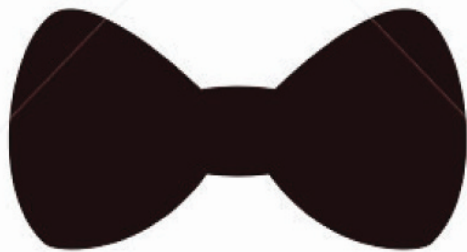

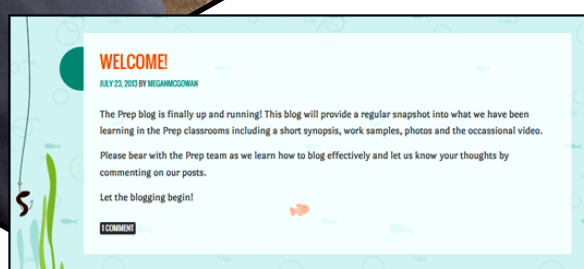
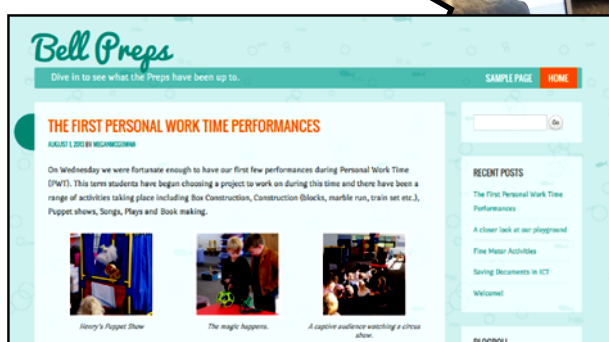

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21st Century learning Through Online Collaboration

This week grade 3/4 students were introduced to the wonders of Google Documents (Docs). Google Docs are an online collaborative space that allows students to work simultaneously on the same document.

Once they have logged into their email address, the students have access to the entire suite of Google Apps. Most of these apps, like Docs, Presentations, Sheets, Forms and Drawings, allow real time collaboration, anywhere, anytime so students could be collaboratively writing the same story and they don't have to be in the same room.

The 3/4 students were amazed at the real time live typing and it quickly dawned on them the potential of writing collaboratively. We look forward to reading some of the creative work that is produced using Google Docs.



Rocket Writing: A Raging Success!

Rocket Writing was a "Raging Success" says 3/4A teacher Mr A. Why? Well it's all because of the introduction of Google Docs.

This is how Mr A set up the learning session:

"I split the kids into groups of 4, with 1 person in charge of creating the doc and sharing it with their team members. Students wrote their story 1 sentence at a time while the other 3 followed along until it was their turn."

It was a raging success! My kids were extremely engaged and were absolutely loving the activity.

I would definitely recommend doing it as an activity, or even linking up with other classes and doing a 3/4 rocket writing session!"

Technology In The Home Survey

We have collated the results of our 'Technology Use in the Home' survey.

This survey was conducted at the beginning of second term and we had a total of 134 respondents out of 250 families. The high number of respondents makes this survey a successful one.

The purpose of the survey was to determine the level of technology use in the homes of Bell Primary School families and draw some comparison with technology use in our teaching and learning. From the survey we can extrapolate some interesting information about the how, what, when and why Bell Primary School families use technology.

Three Way Conferences

Congratulations to all of the participants in our Three Way Conferences at the end of Term Two. There have been some excellent responses from the community as people have shared their experiences.

Some of the comments included the following sentiments:

“I haven’t had a chance to see my child interact in this way with their teacher before and it was great to see how they work together”

We also take on board the fact that some of you would have also liked a one on one interview with your child’s teacher to discuss their report or any other issues that

you wanted to pursue. We would encourage you to make another time with your child’s teacher if you wish to clarify any points of concern.

Teacher responses were also very positive as we reflected on the process as a team and what it meant to us as educators. While we gather a lot of information and data from your child throughout the school year to assist with designing specific learning programs, it was a wonderful opportunity to see children discussing their learning with their parents as an authentic adult audience who were delighted to share this celebration of student learning. Many teachers were also very pleasantly surprised by the reflection and knowledge that the students were able to articulate to their parents and this also provides a window of opportunity for teachers to learn more about your child as they go forward to complete the school year.

Grade 5/6 Sustainability Unit

FOOD WASTE

Did you know that the average Australian household throws out almost 20% of the food that they buy? This amounts to about \$1036 in wasted dollars and food each year and is enough to fill 450,000 garbage trucks!

Last week as part of our sustainability unit, grade 5/6 I did a waste audit. We found that we made 3kg of rubbish and recyclables in one day. Over 1kg of this was compostable food scraps. If we make the same amount of waste every school day, that would mean 200kg of compost is going in our bin every year, just from our grade!

So...if we get a compost bucket and feed the worms we can save 200kg of waste from landfill and making methane.

Library:

Prep:

This term the focus will be on books short listed by the Children's Book Council of Australia for Younger Readers and selected books from the Crichton Award for new illustrators. Characters will continue to be explored and they will be compared between books. The setting will be examined by how it is described in words and images and settings of the various books compared. Aspects such as make-believe versus realistic settings and how settings can create feelings such as happiness or sadness will be investigated.

Year 1/2s

This term the focus will be on books short listed by the Children's Book Council of Australia for Picture Book of the Year and selected books from the Crichton Award for new illustrators. The focus will be on settings and how they establish mood, atmosphere and the environment for the plot. The setting will be examined by how it is described in words and images and the settings of the various books compared. The plot will be investigated by recognising the main events in a story, exploring the beginning, middle and end of stories and identifying how characters' actions impact on events in the plot.

5/6s

The term will start with using atlases to gain information about the world. The term will begin with a study of Australia and using grid references to locate specific locations in Australia. This will be followed by an investigation of the map of the world and the location of various tourist attractions. The unit will conclude with an exploration of Italy and its various regions. Maps and information will be gathered on particular characteristics of regions in Italy.
