#### **Transition**

During fourth term as we continue to work on our current programs, there will be opportunities for Transition from Grade to Grade. Students will not be split into possible grades for 2016 for this part of the transition, it is about 'getting to know the environment and some of the teachers who may be less familiar.' These activities will take place in late November and early December.

#### SCHOOL COUNCIL OCTOBER MEETING

School council has approved the application to DET for a ceiling on school enrolment. The proposal would restrict enrolment to those students for whom Bell P.S. is their closest school. This will reduce numbers significantly and thus reduce the pressure on facilities. I will now begin the necessary discussions with DET managers to put this in place for the 2017 school year.

Marg Sneddon provided an update on the LOTE Review currently being conducted by the Education Sub-Committee. The next step is a community survey that will be coming out very soon.

Geoff Hollis (parent member) made the proposal that School Council promotes the 2015 Annual General meeting widely across the community to encourage greater parent attendance. There was a very positive response to this.

There was some discussion around ways we can engage with dads and male carers in the school community. Active Dads was a group that was run by one of our School Council members that provided events and activities that would appeal to the male section of the community. Ross Kusters (parent member) is going to link up with previous organizers with a view to getting a similar program going in 2016.

The Finance Committee is looking into the introduction of a Building Fund at the school. Once the DET guidelines regarding parent payments are provided to schools, the Finance Committee will make a recommendation to the council.

STRATEGIC INFRASTRUCTURE GROUP (SIG) REPORT

This group of staff and parents meets regularly looking at future

planning for the facilities at the school. All families have been sent the information on the position for the next relocatable that is part of the Master Plan. The SIG will be finishing off the final master plan over the next few weeks. This plan will need to be reviewed regularly in response to change in school needs. Adrian Whitehead (parent) who convenes the Gardens and Grounds Group and is a member of the SIG has been able to place the outdoor seating that is soon to be installed in the best possible position as a result of this work.

This is my last Bellnews for the year. I am going on Long Service Leave after Cup day for the rest of the school year. I am very excited! I am going to spend a month in southern India. I am then going on to the UK to see my son who is at university there and to visit family in Oxford and Edinburgh. When I reflect on this year, there is a very long list of wonderful achievements. 




## Second and final call for Tea-Towels

#### News from the Wellbeing Team!

The Wellbeing Team is continuing its work as a Healthy Together School. Over the course of this year we have continued to work on six of the eight achievement areas. The wellbeing team will continue to report on the different areas each Bell news.

#### Sexual Health and Wellbeing

Our primary focus for 2015 has been to build teacher capacity before introducing a staged –school based Sexual Education Program in 2016 and 2017. We have a number of parents with specific expertise who have joined the sub–committee who is working on this area.

#### Family Life Victoria will be hosting a parent and student information evening on Wednes-day, 18th November.

Staff have participated in three professional development sessions on sexual health and wellbeing. The Department of Education recommends that schools deliver "comprehensive, whole-school sexuality education" that "provides consistent and accurate information to all young Victorians from an early age and is respectful of diversity". We have been assisting staff to build their knowledge and skills with the aim of delivering this level of education across the whole school in 2016/2017.

#### A Gender Neutral Uniform Policy has been developed.

In line with a whole school approach, in 2016 parents can expect information sessions, letters regarding curriculum content and opportunity for further input into policy review.

#### Sun Protection

It is now time to ensure that your child comes to school with a broad brim hat and has their own sunscreen that they can apply themselves. The roll on sunscreen is sometimes easier for younger children to use. The Ultra Violet rating for each day is advertised on the Bell website. Bell Primary School is an accredited <u>Sunsmart</u> school.


#### eSmart Mascot Design






